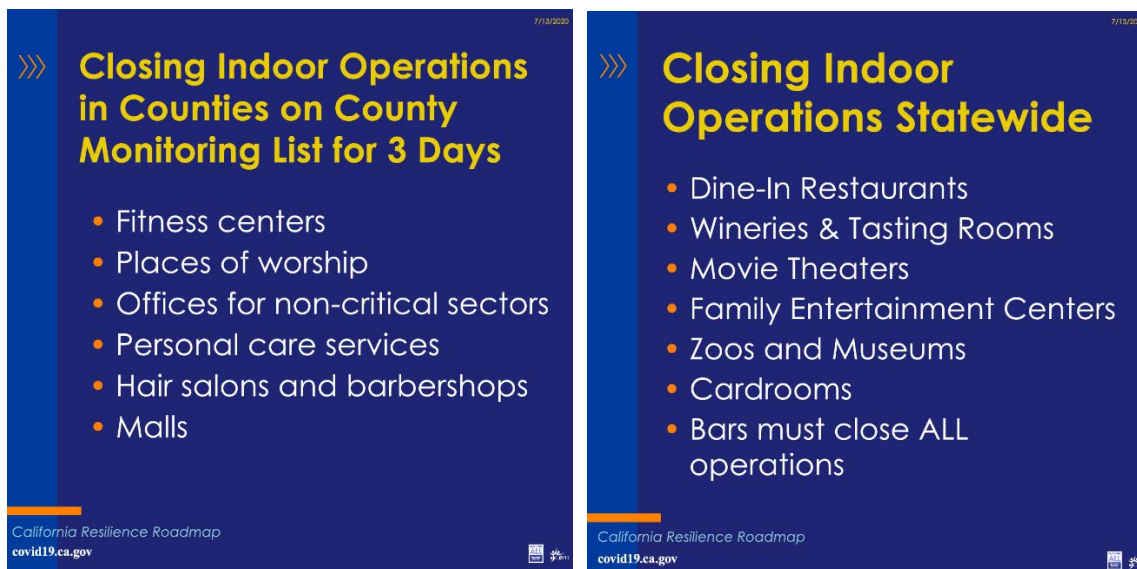


## BUSINESSES & FACILITIES ALLOWED TO RE-OPEN IN ORANGE COUNTY

*The City of Brea continues to work closely with health experts, and State and County officials, to re-open businesses responsibly, safely and at the right time. Business owners and residents are encouraged to comply with all health orders currently in place to reduce the spread of COVID-19.*

Effective immediately, the California Department of Public Health announced additional closures of indoor operations in counties that have been on their monitoring list for three consecutive days. The closures apply to Orange County, along with 29 other counties. The previously announced closures remain in effect, now statewide. - Personal Care Services (Nail Salons, Body Waxing, Tattoo Parlors) – OUTDOORS ONLY
- Pet Groomers
- Places of Worship – OUTDOORS ONLY
- Professional sports without live audiences
- Retail Shopping, with social distancing
- Satellite Wagering Facilities and Racetracks
- Schools and School-Based Programs
- Shopping Malls – OUTDOORS ONLY
- Tanning Facilities
- Tribal Casinos
- Wineries, Tasting Rooms – OUTDOORS ONLY
- Zoos – OUTDOORS ONLY

**Before re-opening, businesses/facilities must perform the following modifications:**

1. Perform a detailed risk assessment and implement a site-specific protection plan
2. Train employees on how to limit the spread of COVID-19, including how to screen themselves for symptoms and stay home if they have them
3. Implement individual control measures and screenings
4. Implement disinfecting protocols
5. Implement physical distancing guidelines
